
Shall I ... ? Shall we ... ?



Shall I / Shall we ... ? = Do you think this is a good thing to do? Do you think this is a good idea?

- 'Let's go out this evening.' 'OK, what time **shall we meet**?'



Write sentences with **Shall we ... ?** Choose from the two boxes.




- 1 Let's go out tonight.

Would you like ... ? = Do you want ... ?

We use **Would you like ... ?** to offer things:

- A: **Would you like** some coffee?
B: No, thank you.
- A: **Would you like** a chocolate?
B: Yes, please.
- A: **What would you like**, tea or coffee?
B: Tea, please.



Can you ... ? Could you ... ?

We use **Can you ... ?** or **Could you ... ?** when we ask people to do things:

- Can you** open the door, please? or **Could you** open the door, please?
- Can you** wait a moment, please? or **Could you** wait ... ?

What do you say in these situations? Use **can** or **could**.

② (pass/salt)




③ (have/postcards)
