Mick: I understand what you want, baby! But it is easy to make the book dirty if you are not careful with it. It is better to do so in the study room.

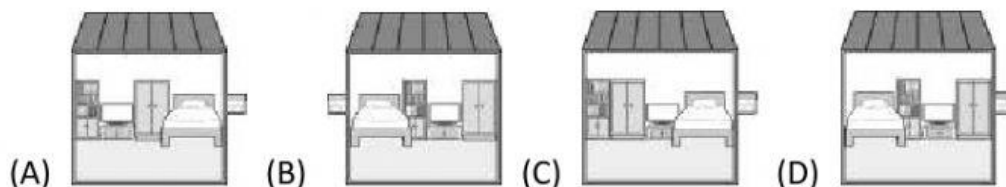
Judy: But we don't have one. That's the problem.
