CARS OF THE FUTURE

People have been talking about self-driving cars, or cars that don't need a driver, for a long time now. These cars can read road lights and "see" other cars and people. They have the technology to see where they're going, what's around them and even what areas to stay away from. The car's computer software manages everything! While the idea of a car without a driver behind the wheel might make some people nervous, these cars will likely be on the road in just a few years. And that might be a good thing!

Safety First

Driving a car can be dangerous. Research shows that drivers experience about four accidents during their lives. It's difficult for a person to make a quick decision to stop an accident, but the computer inside self-driving cars can make safe decisions in less than a second. Because of this, self-driving cars could save millions of lives.

Helping the Environment

In addition to saving lives, self-driving cars may also help to save our planet. The self-driving cars of the future will likely be electric and use less gas, which means cleaner air.

Changing the Way We Live

There are also many people who are too old to drive safely, have an illness, or cannot see or hear well enough to drive. With self-driving cars, these people will no longer have to ask for help to get around. In the US, companies are already thinking of ways to make cars for the people who are unable to drive. In fact, in 2016, a man who couldn't see successfully "drove" one of Google's self-driving cars!

Peoples' lives will be very different once they don't need to spend so much time driving. A study found that Americans spend about an hour driving every day. Think about how much more everyone could get done with all that extra time!
