- použiji v kladné oznamovací větě

I have some cheese.

She wants some apples.

Výjimka: použijeme v otázce, na kterou očekáváme kladnou odpověď:
Can I have some bread, please?

ANY - znamená „nějaké“ v otázce

Have you got any money?

- znamená „žádné“ záporné větě

I haven't got any money.
