Social Media—Good Thing or Bad Thing?

[1] For this editorial, I interviewed 30 students to find out their opinions on social media. Some thought that social media was a completely positive element in their lives, but others thought it had some negative aspects.

[2] The interviewees mentioned three main points in favor of social media. The main positive aspect mentioned was staying connected with people. One boy told me that he had become close to a cousin who lived in another state and that they wouldn't have known each other at all without social media. Several interviewees said that they had made new friends from

other schools, in other states, or even in other countries through online groups interested in specific hobbies or other activities. Finally, several people explained that they had been motivated to become more interested in current events from reading about things their social media friends are interested in.

[3] There are also three main disadvantages to social media, according to the interviewees. The biggest problem mentioned was that more time on social media means less time for face-to-face relationships. One boy said that he had lost his best friend because he had been spending more time with his cyber friends than with his real friend. Another problem is cyberbullying. A shocking 60% of the interviewees reported that they had been the victims of cyberbullying

at least once. One girl said that she couldn't sleep because of anxiety caused by things that people were saying about her online. She said that she had decided to delete her social media accounts and that she was much happier now. The third disadvantage mentioned was the waste of time. Almost all of the interviewees reported that they had had problems getting their schoolwork done because of the distraction of social media.

[4] Parents and teenagers have contradictory opinions on how teenagers perceive social media. Many parents claim that teenagers don't understand that social media has disadvantages. However, my interviews showed that teenagers know that social media is a wonderful tool but that kids should be careful with it because it has some disadvantages.
