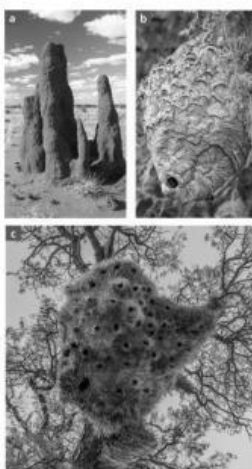

Amazing animal homes

Humans are not the only animals who build interesting homes. There are many different kinds of animal homes in nature. Some of these homes are just as amazing as a human-made palace.

The sociable weaver

Many kinds of birds build small homes for their own eggs. Weavers are different. They build one big nest for many families. The weaver is a bird from southern Africa. It makes its nest with grass and wood, and the nests are always in trees. The home has many rooms—up to 400 birds can live in a single nest!



The termite

In Australia, Africa, and South America, you can see the amazing homes of termites. These homes are incredible because they are very tall. Termites are very small, so it's really amazing that they can make something so big. The termites use mud and wood to build their homes. The homes become a mega-city of termites. These "termite cities" can be 4.6 meters tall, and they are even bigger underground.



The wasp

The story of the wasp home is a bit sad—imagine having to build your home again every year! Wasps use small pieces of wood and plants to make their homes. They then slowly build a lot of little rooms. But the walls are very thin and the home doesn't last a long time, so every year the wasps need to start again and build a new home. You can see wasp homes in trees or next to buildings.

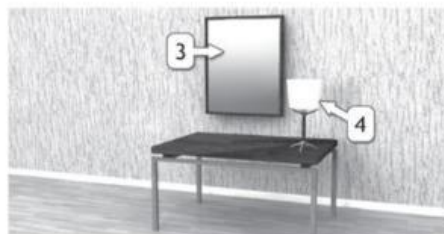
