Gambia

Gambia is a paradise for beach connoisseurs and serious sunbathers. Beautiful beach resorts, short airport transfers and the manageably compact nature of the country make Gambia an ideal choice for family holidays in Africa. Gambia accommodation has improved immensely in recent years as tourism has become more established. Cheap Gambia hotels for backpackers have been joined by stylish, elegant luxury hotels to rival any in Africa. Package holidays to Gambia naturally focus on the superb, long, soft, sandy beaches. While Gambia does not offer the big game safaris of countries like Kenya, there are plenty of exotic sights in pleasantly low-key, unspoiled wildlife parks. The friendly atmosphere, even in the enjoyable capital Banjul, makes Gambia a fine, gentle introduction to Africa.

Families find Corfu especially appealing, with many safe beaches and resorts full of hotels and complexes with plenty of convenient facilities.

Kikambala holidays appeal to those looking for a quiet, hotel-based Kenya holiday rather than lively nightlife. Kikambala holiday nightlife is decidedly modest, with most visitors content to enjoy hotel discos and live bands. All-inclusive holidays in Kikambala are a popular option in the classier, resort-style hotels. While Kikambala holidays tend to revolve around hotel restaurants, you should sample the simple stalls serving delicious Kenyan cuisine and tropical fruits. Local crafts, cloth, carvings and jewellery make excellent Kikambala holiday souvenirs. Most visitors are content to while away their holidays on Kikambala Beach, but there is also a great selection of boat trips and excursions that include the Hallas Nature Park with its hippos and crocodiles, and the beach at Vipingo.
