

USING TOO AND ENOUGH

DEGREE OF COMPARISON



TOO = more than sufficient
= usually used in a negative way
= too + **adjective** / too + **adverb**

ENOUGH = sufficient
= usually used in a positive way
= **adjective** + ENOUGH / **adverb** + ENOUGH

 **NOT ENOUGH** = insufficient
= usually used in a negative way
= NOT + **adjective** + ENOUGH / NOT + **adverb** + ENOUGH

They are **too young**.
You're talking **too loudly**.

We are **early enough**.
They are **old enough**.
You're talking **quietly enough**.

They are **not old enough**.
You're **not talking quietly enough**.
