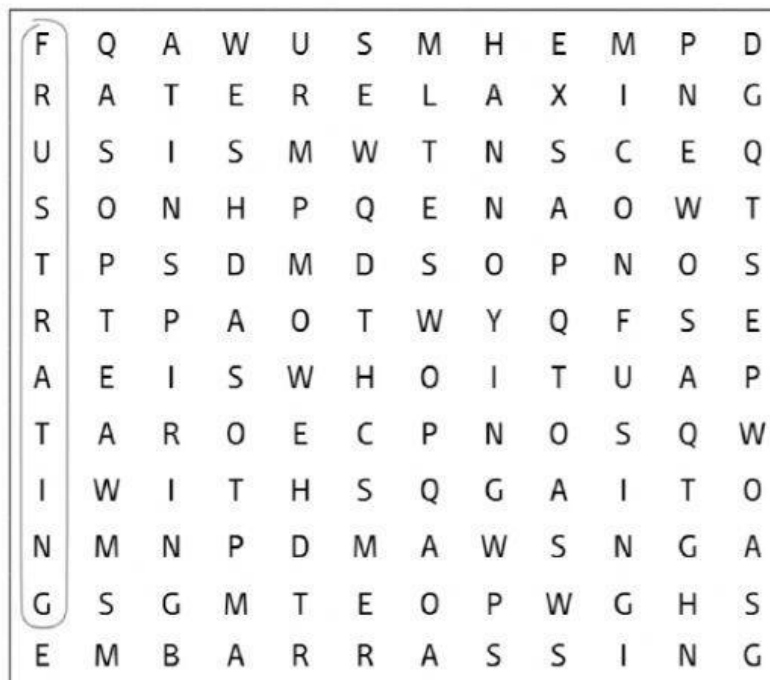


VOCABULARY 1 – ADJECTIVES: FEELINGS
