

What is Autumn?



Autumn is the season that comes after summer and before winter. In other words, it is the season between summer and winter. The autumn months are September, October



and November. In autumn, the days get shorter and the nights get longer. In the UK, autumn starts on September 23rd. The weather changes and it gets colder. There is more rain, wind and fog. It doesn't usually snow in autumn; the snow comes in winter. The leaves on the trees change colour. They turn from green to yellow, gold and red. Many people think that the autumn colours

are beautiful. Finally, the leaves fall from the trees and the trees are bare. In fact, in the US, autumn is called 'fall' because the leaves fall during this time. In autumn, farmers plough their fields and bring in the crops. In the northern hemisphere, many birds migrate south to warmer countries. Some animals, like dormice, get ready to hibernate. Some festivals/celebrations which happen during autumn are Halloween, harvest festivals and in the UK, we celebrate Guy Fawkes Night on November 5th.
