

Who is Jennie Kim?

Biography



Jennie Kim was born in the Seoul Capital Area, South Korea on January 16, 1996. She is an only child of his parents. She is born and brought up in a rich family. When she _____ (be) eight years old, she _____ (go) on a trip with her family to Australia and New Zealand. While in New Zealand, her mother asked her if she liked the place and if she _____ (want) to stay, Kim _____ (reply) "yes".

A year later, she was sent to study at Waikowhai Intermediate School in Auckland, New Zealand, and _____ (live) with a home-stay family. After completing Intermediate, she enrolled at ACG Parnell College. When Kim _____ (be) young, she _____ (dream) of becoming a ballet dancer.

When she _____ (be) 14, her mother _____ (plan) to transfer her to the United States in Florida to continue her studies leading to an occupation of a lawyer or teacher but she _____ (refuse) the idea because Kim heard of K-pop while residing in New Zealand, particularly finding an interest in YG Entertainment's music. Her family supported her decision and soon _____ (have) her move back to South Korea in 2010.

Kim was signed by 'YG Entertainment' as a trainee in 2011. She _____ (be) 14 years when she was signed by 'YG Entertainment'. She _____ (audition) to join YG Entertainment and _____ (perform) Rihanna's "Take a Bow". On April 10, 2012, Kim was introduced to the public through a photo titled "Who's that girl?" via the official blog of YG Entertainment.

On September 1, 2012, Kim was given the opportunity to make her first public appearance as the lead actress in **G-Dragon's** music video "That XX" from his extended play, One of a Kind. She _____ (rise) to fame after appearing in the music video. She also featured on another song "Lotus Flower Bomb" by rapper Wale, "Special" by Lee Hi, and G-Dragon's B-side track "Black".

On August 8, 2016, Jennie _____ (debut) as a member of the girl group Blackpink alongside Jisoo, Rosé, and Lisa with the release of their single album Square featured tracks, 'Boombayah' and 'Whistle.' She _____ (be) the first to be revealed for YG Entertainment on June 1, 2016. According to band-mate Jisoo, she is responsible for the general duties and decision-making of the group.

Jennie _____ (appear) on 'Running Man' with fellow Blackpink member Jisoo in July 2018. video of her crying after going through a horror room with Lee Kwang-soo went viral.. Also, she appeared on other new variety shows.

On November 12, 2018, Jennie _____ (release) a single album titled "Solo" with a lead single of the same name. "Solo" ranked on top on Billboard's World Digital Songs chart, Gaon Music Chart, and _____ (achieve) a triple crown for simultaneously topping the digital, download, and streaming charts. "Solo" went on to become certified platinum for streaming by the KMCA.

"Solo" create so many records and _____ (win) the "Song of the Year – November" at the 8th Gaon Chart Music Awards as well as the "Digital Bonsang" award at the 34th Golden Disc Awards.

At the time of its release, "Solo" became the most viewed music video by a female Korean solo artist of all time within a 24 hour period on YouTube as well as she became the first and only female Korean solo artist to surpass 300 million views on the platform within a time-span of six months since release. And now the song 698 million-plus times watched on YouTube.

In April 2019, she _____ (become) the first Korean solo artist to perform at Coachella. Jennie co-wrote her group's single "Lovesick Girls", which was released on October 2, 2020
