

Tips and examples:

Such might be followed by an adjective + noun	It was such a lovely evening
Such might be followed by a noun in exclamations It might also be followed by a noun when it means 'this type'	He's such a player! I've never heard such music before
Such might be followed by a lot of / lots of	I had never seen such a lot of people together
No such + noun means 'this does not exist'	Aliens! There's no such thing!
Such as means 'for example'	Cities such as London are becoming more and more powerful

Rephrasing. Rewrite these sentences using such, in a way they mean the same. Use the quantity of words specified.

Those people were so noisy that they were expelled from the concert. (3 words)
= Those were that they were expelled from the concert.

He's a very clever man. (2 words)
= He's genius!

The children spoke really good French (3 words)
= The children spoke

You said we should get a film for tonight. Like what? (2 words)
= You said we should get a film for tonight. ?

Because they have so many books, they need to store them in the garage.
= Because they have really a lot of books, they need to store them in the garage. (5 words)
= They have they need to store them in the garage.

It was so cold that the lake froze (2 words)
= It was weather that the lake froze.

I don't often drink so much coffee (4 words)
= I don't often drink coffee.

I've never done anything like this before (3 words)
= I've never before
