

TIPS AND EXAMPLES:

Although we don't agree, I believe she's a brilliant speaker.

= Even though we don't ...

= Despite the fact that we don't...

= Though we don't ...

I enjoyed the course, although I would have liked more practice.

Even though we saw each other every day, we didn't like each other.

She didn't get the job, even though she was well qualified.

I liked the film, though I am not really into romantic films.

THOUGH can also be placed at the end of the sentence.

I enjoyed the course. I would have like more practice, though.

We saw each other every day. We didn't like each other, though.
