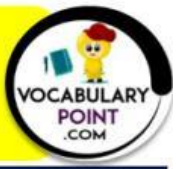




# GERUND PARTICIPLE & INFINITIVE EXAMPLES



GERUND	PARTICIPLE	INFINITIVE
A gerund is that form of verb which ends in "ing" and is partly a noun. It is a verbal noun.	A participle is partly a verb and partly an adjective. Gerund is verb noun whereas participle is verb adjective.	The word infinitive is a kind of noun but it also has the feature of a verb.
<b>Fishing</b> is his hobby.	<b>Playing</b> cards, he set to work.	<b>To fish</b> is his hobby.
<b>Finding</b> fault with others is easy.	<b>Walking</b> along the road, he is tired.	<b>To find</b> fault with others is easy.
<b>Exercising</b> is good for health.	She went away <b>smiling</b> .	<b>To exercise</b> is good for health.
<b>Smoking</b> is injurious to health.	A <b>smiling</b> girl.	<b>To smoke</b> is injurious to health.
She likes <b>singing</b> songs.	A <b>swimming</b> person.	She likes <b>to sing</b> songs.
We dislike <b>cheating</b> .	A <b>singing</b> boy.	We dislike <b>to cheat</b> .
<b>Sleeping</b> makes man lazy.	A <b>sleeping</b> boy.	<b>To sleep</b> makes man lazy.
