

Relative clauses: DEFINING AND NON-DEFINING

Relative clauses give us **information** about the person or thing mentioned.

Defining relative clauses give us **ESSENTIAL** information about someone or something – information that we need in order to understand what or who is being referred to.

Non-defining relative clauses give us **EXTRA** information about someone or something. It isn't essential for understanding who or what we are talking about.

Warning:

The **relative pronouns** WHO, WHICH, and WHOSE can all be used in **non-defining relative clauses**. However, THAT is only used in **defining relative clauses**.
