(When – How long – How much – How often)

(for – since – when – ever)
- 16) He has been at the same school.
(for – since – when – ever)
- 17) I prefer basketball. I it since I was four years old.
(play – played – have played – am playing)
- 18) He football since 2004.
(plays – has played – played – is playing)
- 19) I to his school for two years.
(went – go – have gone – gone)
- 20) I bought the paper but I it yet.
(don't read – haven't read – wasn't read – didn't read)
