


GRAMMAR: Must/ Have to.

Must	Have to
<p>We use must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In the affirmative and question form to express obligation in the present and future. e.g. I must prepare dinner for tonight. [A] [大] Must we leave? [A] [大] In the negative to express prohibition. e.g. You mustn't eat in the museum. [A] [大] 	<p>We use have to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In the affirmative to express obligation in the present and future. e.g. Nick has to clean her room. [A] [大] We form the questions with Do/Does, e.g. Do you have to work in the afternoon? [A] [大] Yes, I do./ No, I don't [A] [大] In the negative form to express absence of obligation. (When something is not necessary.) We form the negative form with don't/doesn't, e.g. I don't have to clean my room every day. [A] [大]
