Czechoslovakia had a democracy before World War II.	A 1948 coup in Czechoslovakia installed a pro-Soviet government.	The USSR used the secret police to control Czechoslovakia's population.	The economy of Czechoslovakia was controlled by the USA.	Various groups, including Catholics, Jews, and politicians, were victims of violence.
Freedom of speech was allowed in Czechoslovakia during this period.	Media in Czechoslovakia was heavily censored.	Khrushchev ordered purges of suspected disloyal individuals in Czechoslovakia.	Military leaders in Czechoslovakia were not among those purged.	By 1966, living standards in Czechoslovakia had significantly declined, leading to student demonstrations in Prague.
