



Past Simple & Past Continuous

★ Past Simple

Use: to talk about situations that occurred in the past and finished in the past.

Example: Yesterday, I played tennis.

Structure: Pronoun (I, you, she, he, it, we, they) + verb in the past.

Auxiliaries: DID / DIDN'T

✳️ **Auxiliaries:** palabras que ayudan a crear preguntas o oraciones en negativo.

⚠️ **YOU / WE / THEY / I / HE / SHE / IT**

+

VERB (IN THE PAST)

Example: We **WATCHED** TV at 7.

We **didn't watch** TV at 7.

Did you watch TV at 7?

⚠️ **TO BE** in the past:

- IS / AM ----- **WAS**
- ARE ----- **WERE**

💡 **Regular and irregular verbs in the past**

➡️ **Regular verbs**, we add -D / ED
Example: watch - watched

➡️ **Irregular verbs**, they change their form
Example: go - went

🎯 We use the past simple to talk about events, states or habits at definite times in the past. The past continuous emphasises the action or event in progress around a time in the past.

🎯 The past continuous always use the verb TO BE in the past form and the verb with -ing

🎯 The past simple uses the verb in the past form (regular form or irregular form)

★ Past Continuous

Use: to show that something continued for some time in the past.

Example: Yesterday, I was playing tennis.

Structure: Pronoun (I, you, she, he, it, we, they) + TO BE in the past form + verb -ing

Auxiliaries: **WAS / WASN'T**

WERE / WEREN'T

⚠️ **YOU / WE / THEY / I + WERE / WEREN'T + VERB -ing**

Example: We **were watching** TV at 7.

We **weren't watching** TV at 7.

Were you **watching** TV at 7?

⚠️ **HE / SHE / IT / I + WAS / WASN'T + VERB -ing**

Example: She **was watching** TV at 7.

He **wasn't watching** TV at 7.

Was she **watching** TV at 7?

🚫 We do **NOT** normally use the past continuous with **STATIC VERBS**.

We use the past simple instead:

➡️ **Example:** When I got home, I really **needed** (NOT **was needing**) a shower
