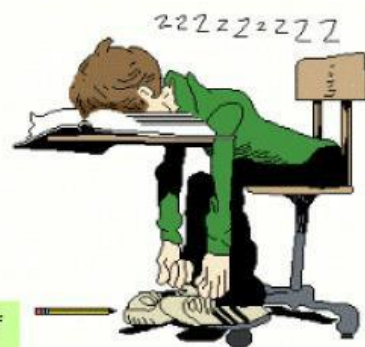


Are you tired or are you tiring?
