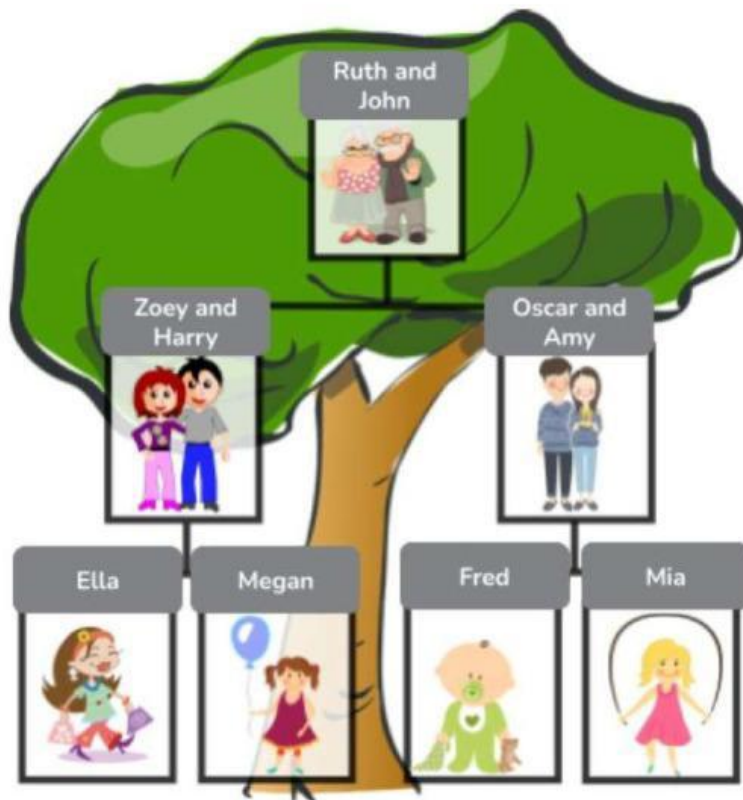

Read about the British Royal Family below and then answer the questions.

The British Royal Family

The British royals have a very big family tree. It starts with Queen Elizabeth II, who is married to Prince Phillip. They live in Buckingham Palace in London. The Queen is 94 years old and Prince Phillip is 99 years old. Together, they have four children.

Prince Charles, the son of Queen Elizabeth, was married to Princess Diana but they divorced in 1996. When they were married, they had two sons together - Prince Harry and Prince William. Princess Diana died in a tragic car accident in 1997 in Paris when she was only 36 years old.

Prince William and his wife Kate Middleton have three children called George, Charlotte

and Louis. They have one cousin named Archie who is one year old. Therefore, Queen Elizabeth II has four great-grandchildren.

Prince Harry and Megan Markle are Archie's parents. Kate Middleton is his aunt and Prince William is his uncle. Prince Harry and Megan Markle recently decided to leave the Royal family and now live in California in the United States.

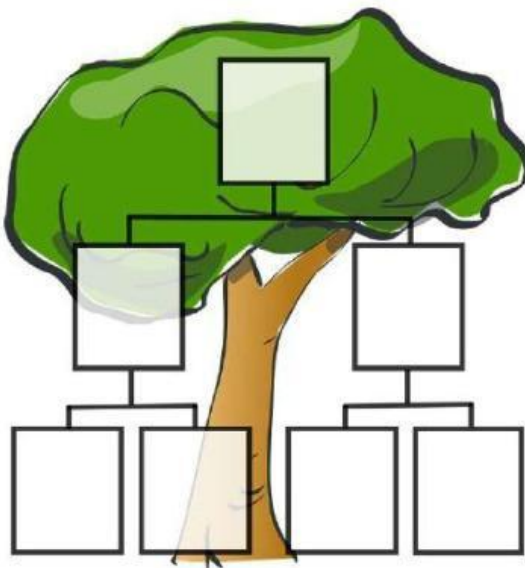
