

PRONUNCIATION

You already know the different types of A sounds that we have in English.

/ʌ/ CENTRAL A

It's similar to our A sound

EXAMPLES:

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/ɑ:/ LONG A

You make this sound in the back of the throat. Like yawning.

EXAMPLES:

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/æ/ FRONT A

We need to spread our lips and practice this sound taking out the tongue. Like a mad cat sound.

EXAMPLES:

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/ə/ SCHWA

This is a neutral sound. That means, we don't move our articulations much. It's a short sound.

EXAMPLES:

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/ɛ:/ OPEN -MID

This is a neutral sound too but it is longer than the schwa.

EXAMPLES:

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/s/ ALVEOLAR FRICATIVE

Because of our region we need to get used to pronounce this sound at initial and final positions.
