Present Progressive (affirmative - negative)

AFFIRMATIVE	NEGATIVE
I'm playing	I'm not playing
You're playing	You aren't playing
He's playing	He isn't playing
She's playing	She isn't playing
It	It
We	We
You're playing	You aren't playing
They	They

We use the Present Progressive for actions that are happening at the moment of speaking.

My brother isn't watching TV now.

He's talking on the phone.

NOTE take - taking
get - getting **BUT** happen - happening
