### SOME THOUGHTS ON HAPPINESS

Popular belief, along with research, all seem to lead to a common conclusion about happiness: experiences bring more joy than possessions. However, figuring out what makes us happy may not be that simple. According to recent studies, there are different types of happiness, and there are different types of possessions. The happiness that an experience provides isn't necessarily the same as the happiness we get from our possessions. And, certain possessions can bring more happiness than others.

Research suggests that there are three kinds of happiness: anticipatory happiness, momentary happiness, and afterglow happiness. In other words, before, during, and after happiness. While experiences provide strong feelings of pleasure while they are taking place, experiences don't last. When the experience is over, we can enjoy the memory, but it no longer provides the strong feelings of momentary happiness. Both experiences and possessions can bring us pleasure; they just do it in different ways.

However, when it comes to happiness, not all possessions are the same. Rather, the items that allow us to have certain experiences, like a baseball bat or a guitar, are the ones that are likely to make us happier. This may be because they fill many of the same needs that experiences do. Experiences make us happy because they allow us to feel independent, skilled, or connect to others. Certain possessions can do the same. A baseball bat, for instance, can allow you to learn a new sport and provide you with opportunities to meet new people or spend time with friends as you play. Art supplies provide you with the materials to express yourself. When it comes to happiness, these studies remind us that it's important to think about what kind of happiness we're looking for and what experiences or possessions might help us find it.
