### LIVING THE CALIFORNIA DREAM?

Imagine you have millions of dollars to build your dream home. You find the perfect place for it on a cliff with views of the ocean. There's sunshine for most of the year. However, there are also earthquakes and wildfires. And then there is the rain and the landslides that sometimes push million dollar homes into the ocean. Would you still build it there?

It may sound crazy, but there are many people who have done just that. They live in Malibu, California, a city that experiences regular earthquakes, fires, and landslides. But it's also a city with beautiful beaches, beautiful weather, and an easy drive to Los Angeles.

#### **Why is there so much shaking, burning, and sliding?**

The mountains are one of the reasons that make Malibu so beautiful. However, the force that created those mountains also causes earthquakes. Thankfully, many of them are so small that no one ever feels them. And, the earthquakes people do feel haven't caused much damage yet.

Malibu's wildfires, on the other hand, have caused damage in the past. In summer, the weather gets hot and dry. Many of the local plants, like chaparral, can survive this weather, but they dry out as well. This makes them perfect fuel for a wildfire. Strong Santa Ana winds, along with the dry chaparral, make it difficult to fight fires when they do start. The Corral Fire in 2007 was the last one that did a lot of damage; it destroyed 53 homes and damaged another 35.

Many people might welcome rain after a fire; however, because of Malibu's steep mountains, large amounts of rain can lead to landslides. After a fire, there is an even greater chance of landslides because there are fewer plants to keep the wet ground from sliding down the mountains. During one ten year period, Malibu experienced four landslides that damaged some homes.

#### **They keep coming back**

However, all the earthquakes, fires, and landslides haven't kept people away. There are about 13,000 people who live in Malibu, including many Hollywood stars. Some have lost expensive homes in fires or landslides, but they have still chosen to stay and rebuild their homes. For these 13,000 people, the beauty of Malibu is more powerful than the weather.
