

The imperative verbs

The use: We use **the imperative** verb to:

1- Give orders:

Be quiet!

Sit down!

Listen to me!



2- Give instructions:

Open your book on page 13.

Read the text carefully.



3- Give warnings:

Don't smoke. It is bad for your health.

Don't drive too fast. The road is icy.



4- Give advice:

Study hard and you will pass the exam.

Exercise at least three times a week.



5- Signs:

Stop.

Give way.

Go.

Don't litter.



***Affirmative sentence:**

The structure (rule): The base form of the main verb, which is used without a subject + com.

e.g1: **Open** your books.

e.g2: **Be** careful!

***Negative sentence (Neg):**

The structure: Don't+ the base form of the main verb, which is used without a subject +com.

e.g1: **Don't open** your books.

e.g. 2: **Don't play** here.
