Zero conditional

We use **zero conditional** sentences to talk about situations that always happen or facts that are always true.

I bring a bag with me when I go shopping.

How do you feel if someone copies your work?

First conditional

We use **first conditional** sentences to talk about situations that we think are possible and probable.

What will happen if I don't pass the exam?

If I see Hannah, I might ask her about the letter.

| if clause | if + simple present |
| Result clause | will / won't / might + infinitive without to |

Second conditional

We use **second conditional** sentences to talk about situations that aren't true now or that we don't think will happen.

If I could play the guitar, I'd start a band.

Would you give money to charity if you became rich?

|---------------|--|
| if clause | if + simple past |
| Result clause | would / wouldn't + infinitive without to |

Tip Sometimes we only use either a condition clause or a result clause.

Imagine if everyone had enough food to eat.
