

1 Bird and Man

This is a story about an eagle* called Sampson. Eagles are big, strong birds. Most eagles fly very fast. They like flying alone.

Sampson is different from other eagles. He has a sad past. When he was young, Sampson wasn't free*. He was shut* in a cupboard for six months.

Sampson is now part of Mr. Marshall's family. Mr. Marshall is a bird-trainer*. He is also a pilot – he flies a small airplane. Mr. Marshall teaches Sampson how to fly. How does he do this? He puts meat on the tail of his airplane and flies up into the sky. Then, he calls Sampson and the eagle flies after him. It's amazing to see the bird and the airplane flying together.

Mr. Marshall says, "Golden eagles live until they are 40 or 50, so Sampson and I will grow into old men together."


