The British Isles

- Ireland and Great Britain
- Geographic term – all islands in the area – Ireland, Great Britain, smaller ones in archipelago
- Controversial – Ireland – British imperialism

The United Kingdom

- A – England, B – Northern Ireland, C – Scotland, D – Wales
- United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland
- Created Acts of Union 1800 – Kingdom of Ireland and Kingdom of Great Britain union
- After Irish War of Independence – 1922 – Republic of Ireland / Irish Free State broke away
- Wales, Scotland, England

Great Britain

- Kingdom of England and Kingdom of Scotland
- Queen Elisabeth, I dies without an heir – James VI inherited the throne – became king James I of England – Union between two kingdoms – created Great Britain
- Northern Ireland

England

- England – part if United Kingdom and Great Britain

British Isles – islands

Great Britain – England, Wales, Scotland

United Kingdom – England, Wales, Scotland, Northern – Ireland

England – one constituent country of UK
