Position of frequency adverbs:

Affirmative

Vicky **usually** drives to work. **before the main verb**

Vicky is **never** late for work. **after the verb to be**

Negative

Vicky doesn't **usually** walk. **after the auxiliary (don't/doesn't)**

Vicky isn't **often** late for work. **after the verb to be (negative)**

Questions

Does Vicky **usually** drive to work? **after the subject**

Is Vicky **sometimes** late for work?
