Cadbury's Story

In 1824 John Cadbury opened his first store at 93 Bull Street in Birmingham city centre, selling tea, coffee, cocoa and drinking chocolate. Drinking chocolate was seen as a healthy drink. In 1931, John purchased a four-storey factory on Crooked Lane. John was selling almost 30 varieties of drinking chocolates and cocoa.

As the business continued to grow, John asked his brother Benjamin for a helping hand and Cadbury became known as Cadbury Brothers. The Cadbury brothers' business continued to grow, and in 1947 they moved to a larger factory.

The birth of Bournville began when the Cadbury brothers found a large site in a countryside village, buying the land and calling it Bournville. The site had a cottage, a stream and a pear tree, and the tree is still there to this day.

By the 1900s, Cadbury had built their new factory along with a 'model village' for their workers, with more than 300 cottages and houses close to schools and shops.

In 1905 Cadbury first produced Dairy Milk, their most popular product of all time. Though Cadbury is now owned by American company, the village of Bournville will always be at the heart of Cadbury's.

To this day, Bournville remains a village with original history. The factory is still a popular attraction and many of the buildings and cottages built in the late 1800s still stand.

Basketball News

The National Basketball Association (NBA) announced that 108 international players from a record 42 countries are playing in the opening night games for the 2018-19 season.

In particular, the head coach is hopeful that the 'Greek Freak', NBA superstar Giannis Antetokounmpo will play for Greece in September. He stated "unless something extraordinary and very serious arises, I think he will come to the national team. He is aware of everything about the camp, he has the training programme. He has shown interest and I think he will be in the national team for the first games of the next stage."

The Greek National Basketball team is just one of the handful of teams still unbeaten in the International Basketball Federation (FIBA) Basketball World Cup 2019 European Qualifiers, winning all five games in the first stage.

Head coach Thanasis Skourtopoulos, who has been in charge of the team since the start of the qualifiers, said "from the very first moment I made clear that all of the players that are here belong to this team. It is very important to expand the national team base."

But even when Giannis joins the national team, Skourtopoulos promises not to forget the effort and commitment of all players involved in the Qualifiers. "We want to show that we operate properly. And I'm sure there are places in the final games for the players who made a huge effort during the matches if we qualify for the World Cup in China," he said.
