### Verbs (to express preference) + to-infinitives

I **love to play** folk games.

She **prefers to play** spinning tops.

They **don't like to go** to the park.

A: What **do they like to do**?

B: They **like to play** folk games.

A: **Do they like to play** shuttlecock?

B: Yes, they **do**. / No, they **don't**. They **prefer to play** soccer.

### Adverbs of frequency

I **always/usually/often/sometimes/rarely/never** play with my brother.

He **doesn't always/usually/often** play folk games.

A: **Do you always/usually/often** play games after school?

B: Yes, I **do**. / No, I **don't**.

A: **Who do you usually** play spinning tops with?

B: I **usually** play spinning tops with my classmates.
