City Farms

The countryside has many farms but there are also farms in cities. City farms allow people who live in crowded places to feel closer to nature, grow or buy their own food and see animals.

City farms are charities, so they do not receive money from the government. There are about 120 city farms in the UK. The first of these opened in Kentish Town in north London in 1972. When people in east London saw how successful the farm was, they started Hackney City Farm in 1984. They bought the site, which was an old car park.

Some London farms have more than 150 animals. Hackney City Farm is very popular and is open for visits from Tuesday to Sunday. Local people can learn to paint, ride horses or repair bicycles there. The farm also has a shop, which sells its own fruit and vegetables, and a café. Just five miles from Hackney is Mudchute Farm, which is the biggest in Europe.

Yasmin often visits Mudchute. She says, 'I live in a tiny flat. I come here at weekends because unfortunately I don't have a garden. My favourite thing is the classes. I'm learning how to grow vegetables and keep bees. I've never done these things before and they are great fun. People here are very friendly.'
