

PAST SIMPLE / PAST CONTINUOUS

Past simple	Past continuous
Form: we add "ed" to all regular verbs, <i>Irregular verbs must be learnt by heart. (naučit se nazpaměť)</i>	Form: was/were + verb + ing
We use the Past Simple for something in the past which is finished.	The Past Continuous means that at a time in the past we were in the middle of an action.
