Preposition 介词 for time

at, in, on, for, to, during, to, after

We use *in*, *on* and *at* for lots of different times. Here's a table comparing the uses:

Well, sometimes we don't use a preposition of time, for example *after/next/this/last/every*.

*We go skateboarding **every** Saturday afternoon.*

*I'll see you **next** Friday.*

*I saw him **last** Friday.*

For **dates**. We say "**on** the eighth of July".

On Monday, we have a class.

We use *in* for talking about something **in the future** a certain length of time from now.

Our class will finish **in 3 weeks**.

*She'll be back **in a moment**.*

*We're going away **in two weeks**.*
