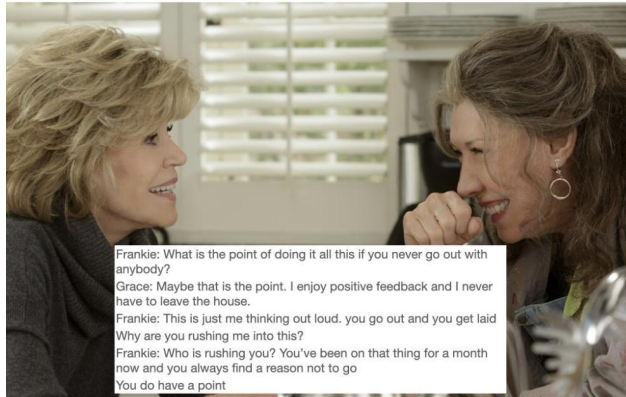

What might be the point of keeping a diet?

Earthquake, the sudden shaking of the ground, can range from a gentle **rumble** to devastating tremors causing **casualties** and **damage**. Often, a **foreshock** precedes the main earthquake, alerting us to **stay alert**.

Shallow quakes, those close to the Earth's surface, produce more **aftershocks**. It's essential to be prepared for these, as they can cause further **damage** and **outrages**. A quake near the ocean might **mean tsunami risk** – a reminder to **drive safe** if you're on coastal roads.

Before the quake, take precautions. **Leave the phone line open for emergency purposes**, **turn off the gas**, and secure heavy furniture to prevent injuries. If you're indoors, find a safe spot away from windows and be cautious of falling objects.

After the quake, be alert for aftershocks. They can cause additional **damage** and **cracks in the ceiling**. Assess the surroundings for any hazards before moving. In the aftermath, the priority is safety. **Drive safe, stay alert**, and follow emergency procedures to minimize **casualties** and **damage**. By being prepared and informed, we can navigate through and recover from the challenges earthquakes present.

Damage	The shaking of the ground caused by a sudden release of energy in the Earth's crust.
Emergency Purposes	A low, continuous, deep sound, often like distant thunder.
Earthquake	Earthquakes that occur near the Earth's surface, typically producing more aftershocks.
Aftershock	A smaller earthquake that follows the main earthquake.
Crack	A small earthquake that often precedes a larger earthquake.
Outrages	Actions or measures taken to address a sudden and serious situation.
Rumble	Acts of extreme violence or cruelty that cause public shock and anger.
Shallow Quakes	Harm or injury to property or a person.
Foreshock	A narrow opening or break in something, often a surface.
