

Subject and verb – autumn sentences

Subject: (the person, place, or thing)

Verb: A verb shows **the action** (read, walk, run, learn), or **state of being** (is, am, are, was, were) in the sentence.

Ask: ***what is happening in this sentence, what is the subject doing?***

1. Autumn comes after winter.	
Subject	Verb

2. The months are March, April and May.	
Subject	Verb

3. Daylight saving finishes.	
Subject	Verb

4. In autumn, the nights get colder.	
Subject	Verb

5. We pick the last summer vegetables.	
Subject	Verb

6. We freeze the vegetables.	
Subject	Verb

7. Some people swim at the beach.	
Subject	Verb

8. The water is colder.	
Subject	Verb

9. The trees change colour.	
Subject	Verb

10. The leaves fall to the ground.
