Our brains are amazing, and here are a few reasons why. First, human brains use electricity. Brain cells called neurons produce chemical and electrical signals to tell your body to do things, such as walk. Second, the brain is like the autobahn of information. After electrical and chemical signals are made in your brain, they're passed from one neuron to the next at incredible speeds. Sometimes they travel across the brain at about 260 miles (418 km) an hour.

When you close your hand to make a fist, this is about the size of your brain. The brain weighs around 1.3 kg. But amazingly it holds 400 miles (643 km) of blood vessels, some 100 billion neurons, and around a trillion glial cells—a type of cell that protects and supports neurons. Also, our brains are active all the time—24/7. You're thinking throughout the day, whether you're awake or asleep. Some experts guess that humans have around 70,000 thoughts a day. Lastly, your brain can change. Certain activities such as studying a new language, exercising, and learning to juggle can increase gray matter. This is the material in the brain that helps you process information. Many scientists believe that the more gray matter you have, the faster your brain works. Now that's amazing!
