2. A bakery had 508 cupcakes. If they sold 189 cupcakes, how many cupcakes are left in the bakery?
3. There are 725 students in a school. If 312 students graduate, how many students are still in the school?
4. Jim had 497 marbles, and he lost 148 of them. How many marbles does Jim have now?
5. There are 654 passengers on a train. If 287 passengers get off at the first station, how many passengers remain on the train?
6. In a store, there were 874 toys. If 356 toys were sold last week and 217 toys were sold this week, how many more toys were sold last week than this week?
7. There are 789 students in a school. If 368 students attend the morning session and 245 students attend the afternoon session, how many more students attend the morning session than the afternoon session?
8. Sarah has 596 marbles, but she gave 327 marbles to her friend. If Tom has 458 marbles, who has more marbles, Sarah or Tom?
9. A factory produced 825 gadgets. If 297 gadgets were found to be defective and had to be discarded, how many non-defective gadgets are left?
10. Tom had 874 stickers, but he gave 358 stickers to his classmates. If Emily has 497 stickers, who has more stickers, Tom or Emily?

11. There were 932 candies in a jar. If 576 candies were eaten, how many candies are left in the jar, and how many more candies were originally in the jar than the number eaten?
12. In a basket, there were 765 apples. If 398 were green apples and the rest were red, how many more red apples are there than green apples?
13. A library had 987 books. If 568 books are fiction and the rest are non-fiction, how many more fiction books are there than non-fiction books?
14. Emily has 765 dollars, but she spent 398 dollars on clothes. If Sarah has 542 dollars, who has more money, Emily or Sarah?
15. There were 896 balloons at a party. If 487 balloons were red and the rest were blue, how many more red balloons are there than blue balloons?
