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Strasbourg, The Christmas City

Officially named "Notre-Dame de Strasbourg" ("Our Lady of Strasbourg"), the Cathedral was built in a Gothic style.

The statue of the trumpeter in the cathedral: Next to the cathedral, a statue of a trumpeter pays tribute to the musicians who once warned the city of impending dangers. Legend has it that the trumpeter fell asleep while warning of the arrival of enemy troops.

A city of canals

Strasbourg is known for its network of canals, which were once used for transportation and commerce, and are now a popular tourist attraction. The Petite France quarter is particularly picturesque, with its half-timbered houses, narrow streets, and charming canal-side restaurants.
