We use the First Conditional to talk about **possible future situations** and the **consequences**.

If clause (condition)

comma

main clause (result)

If a condition **exists**

,

the result **will be** true.

present

future

→ If you **study**, you **will pass** the exam.

→ If we **win**, we **will celebrate** soon. ←

→ We **will celebrate** soon **if we win**. ←

NO COMMA when you put the main clause at the beginning

Do NOT use **will** in the IF clause: *I'll help you if you need me (NOT if you will need me)*
