

Present Simple and Present Continuous

PRESENT SIMPLE

PRESENT CONTINUOUS

■ **Present Simple:**
actions that happen regularly.

■ **Present Continuous:**
actions that are taking place now. It's also used for future arrangements.

Remember the adverbs of frequency are used before the main verb but after the verb "to be".

Write "s" next to the expression we use with the present simple and "c" next to the ones used with the present continuous.

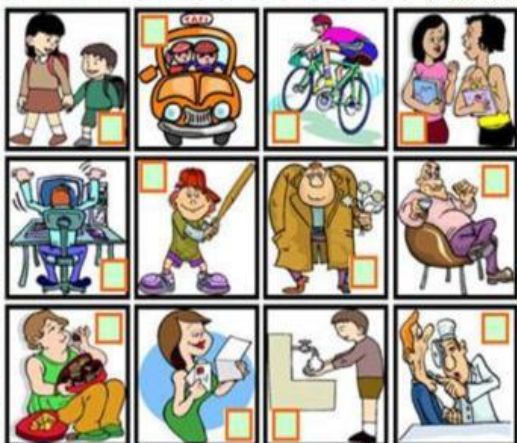
