a star as it falls toward earth (ดาวตก)
- sleeping bag (n.): a large, insulated, usually zippered bag for
sleeping, especially outdoors (ถุงนอน)

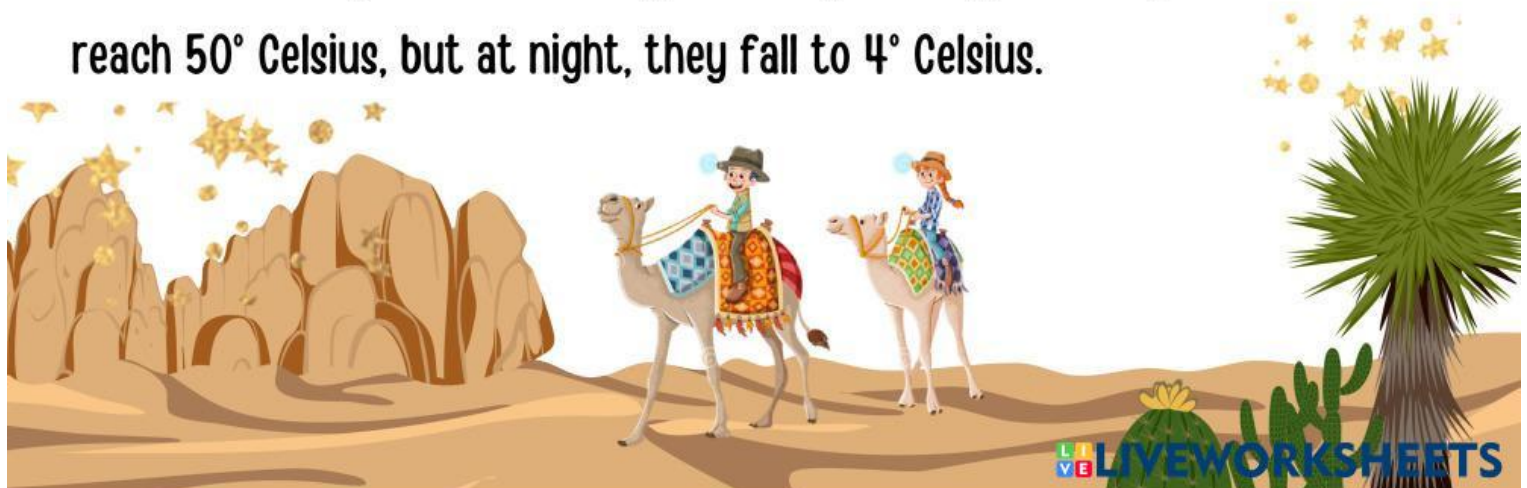
