The World's Smallest Cat?

There are more than 40 different wild cats on earth. The biggest is the Siberian tiger from Asia, which grows to 3.3 metres long. The rusty-spotted cat is one of the world's *smallest* wild cats. It lives in the forests of Sri Lanka and India. It looks like a normal pet cat except for its size. An adult rusty-spotted cat is about 35 - 40 cm long.

The colour of their fur means that it is not easy to see these cats in the forest. This is why scientists don't know much about them. Their fur is orange and red with brown spots. This is the same colour as the leaves. We know that they live in trees and are excellent hunters. Their diet is mostly small mice and birds but they can catch and eat small chickens, which makes farmers angry.

Unfortunately, the numbers of these cats is falling. Ten years ago, there were over 15,000 rusty-spotted cats in the wild. Now, there are only 10,000 of them. This is because people are cutting down the forests where the cats like to live. These people do this because they need to build houses.

Unlike most cats, the rusty-spotted cat can swim very well. In the rainy season, from June to September, up to 50cm of rain can fall in one day. The cats must be good at swimming and climbing trees. Luckily, they can do both.
