

- 1 Read the story about Ebenezer Scrooge by Charles Dickens and choose the correct option.

It was a cold Christmas Eve. Ebenezer Scrooge, a mean greedy old man, was sitting in his counting house. He was a real miser: it was freezing cold inside, but he refused to spend money on heating coals for a fire. Later in the evening, Scrooge's nephew came to invite him to his Christmas party. Then two gentlemen dropped by (зашли / увайшли) and asked Scrooge to donate some money to their charity. Ebenezer wasn't happy to see the visitors and didn't want to give any money.

After a short walk around the festive town, Ebenezer Scrooge returned to his dark cold apartment. That evening the ghost of his dead partner, Jacob Marley, visited him and told him his story. Marley had been punished for his greedy and self-serving life by having to walk the earth in heavy chains (цепи / ланцюги). Marley wanted to warn Scrooge and save him from the same fate (судьба / лёс). He told Scrooge that three spirits would visit him during each of the next three nights.

The first ghost was a strange childlike creature with a brightly glowing head. It was the Ghost of Christmas Past. The spirit took Scrooge back into his childhood and youth where he was able to meet his love, Belle, who had left him because he loved money more than anything. Ebenezer Scrooge was deeply moved and started crying.

The second ghost was the Ghost of Christmas Present. It was a giant dressed in a green fur coat, who took Scrooge around London and showed him how differently people were celebrating Christmas. He saw a crippled young boy (калека / калека) whose kindness moved Scrooge to tears. The Ghost also took him to his nephew's Christmas party, which Ebenezer found so wonderful that he wanted to stay till the end. At the end of the evening the Ghost showed Scrooge two starving children, Ignorance and Want. The Ghost quickly disappeared as a dark hooded figure approached Scrooge.

That was the last ghost — the Ghost of Christmas Yet to Come. He showed Scrooge several mysterious things related to the death of a stranger. Scrooge saw how some businessmen were discussing the dead man's fortune and wealth. He also saw a poor couple happy to hear the news about their unforgiving creditor. Scrooge asked the Ghost to tell him the name of the stranger. Suddenly he found himself near a grave. When he looked at the headstone, he was shocked to read his name. He begged the Spirit to change his fate and promised to be generous and kind to people. After that he woke up in his bed.

Full of joy by that chance to be alive, Ebenezer Scrooge rushed into the street to share his happiness. He sent a giant turkey to the crippled boy's family and went to his nephew's party. As the years went by, he kept his promise and always helped the poor, donated money to charity and related other people with kindness, generosity and respect.
