

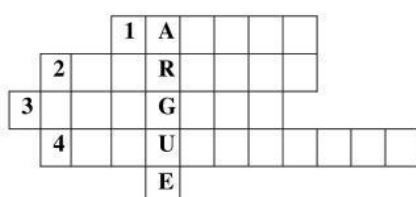

Studying Abroad

Have you always dreamed of travelling, meeting lots of people, and maybe picking up a language or two? No matter what country you live in, you can learn world trade in Japan, study in France, or take dancing lessons in Ghana. How? You could join a study program where high-school and college students live with a host family in a foreign country. Semester, summer, and year-long programmes allow you to attend school, take intensive language courses or perform community service in another country.

Besides the excitement of travelling, you will experience new customs, foods, art, and music. **A** _____. This is because your viewpoint will be of an active member of the community, not as a tourist.

Another reason for studying abroad is that you'll become more self-assured. Renata, who studied in Caracas, Venezuela says that she learned how to be better at standing up for herself and her beliefs, and to express herself in another language. **B** _____. In addition, living away from home can also help you adjust in the transition to college and adulthood. Matthew says when he returned from studying in Australia, he was more mature and had a genuine interest in international affairs that set him apart from his peers.
