WHAT TO KNOW ABOUT PUBERTY?

For some teens, puberty can be a confusing and difficult period. But as you learn about it, you will find that it's just a normal part of growing up.

Some students in Việt Nam are struggling with the fear of bullying caused by their peers. Understanding reasons for bullies' behaviours can easily solve this problem.

1 Bullies need a sense of control

Some students can't do what they want because they have to obey their teachers and parents. As a result, they need a sense of control and they may find that from bullying their friend.

2 Bullies need attention

Bullies are often lonely. Friends don't really care about them, and neither do their family. Therefore, they can do anything to find attention, even causing harm to their friends.

3 Bullies used to be victims

In the past, they might experience mental and physical violence from their family or friends. The pain makes them feel hopeless and depressed. They don't want to suffer alone so they tend to hurt other people the same way.
