The Elizabethan Theatre usually was a round building with the stage in the centre open to the sky with a central area for a standing audience. People bought seats in the galleries round the sides. If the weather was too bad, there was no performance. The English Renaissance Theatre declined after the death of Shakespeare.

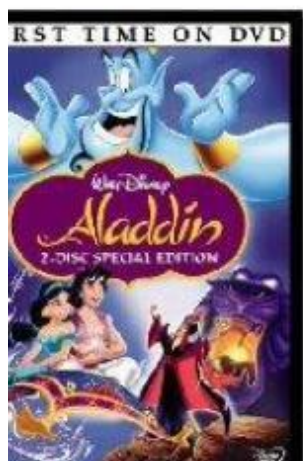
Read the descriptions of the following children's animation movies and try to guess what movies they refer to.

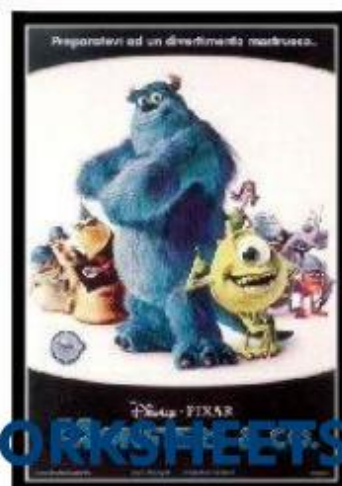
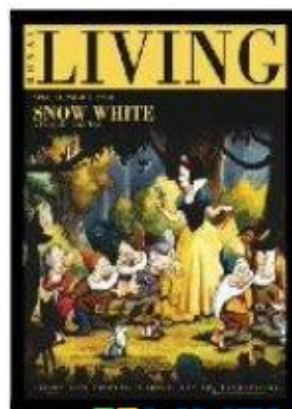
