## 1 SINCE AND FOR

### Since:

Indicates a (specific) starting point  
I have been a dancer since I was fourteen years old.

### For:

Indicates the duration/period of time  
Kim has lived here for two years.

## 2 YET

-it's used in negative and interrogative sentences (at the end)  
- indicates an action that has not happened but we think it will  
I haven't done my homework yet. (But I will.)

## 3 EVER/NEVER

It's used to talk about our experience:  
-ever (interrogative)  
-never (negative)  
Have you ever played tennis?  
I've never been to Greece.

## 4 ALREADY

Indicates an action that was completed, even before it was expected  
-affirmative sentences  
I have already cleaned my room.  
Aux.verb + already + past participle

## 5 JUST

Refers to an action completed very recently  
He has just left.  
Aux.verb + just + past participle
