

RELATIVE CLAUSE

A **relative clause** is a group of words that adds information about a noun in a sentence. It helps specify or describe the noun more clearly, often starting with words like "**who**," "**which**," or "**that**."

There are two main types of **relative clauses**:

DEFINING RELATIVE CLAUSE

A defining relative clause is a group of words that provides **essential information about a noun**, helping to identify which person, thing, or idea is being referred to in a sentence. **They are not separated by commas.**

NON-DEFINING RELATIVE CLAUSE

These clauses provide **additional information about the noun** they modify, but this information is not crucial for understanding the noun's identity. **Non-defining relative clauses are set off by commas.**

Example: Defining Relative Clause

The car **that** is parked in front of the house is mine.

Example: Non-Defining Relative Clause

My brother, who lives in London, is coming to visit me.
